ATHENS SUMMER SCHOOL BYZANTINE AESTHETICS

The School of Philosophy of the National and Kapodistrian University of Athens presents a Summer School on Byzantine Art (15 – 26 July 2024)

Byzantine Aesthetics is one of the most distinctive periods in the History of Art with its own, very particular style, immediately discernible and which exerted a major influence on the evolution of artistic expression and aesthetics.

This intensive course explores fundamental aspects of the world of Byzantine art such Byzantine Philosophical Aesthetics, Byzantine Painting and Byzantine Music.



Workshops will allow students to gain an in-depth understanding of the theory and practices of Byzantine Art. A series of visits to important archaeological sites, monuments and museums will allow an understanding of the distinctive Byzantine style.

Program Structure: The program includes daily course class sessions, smaller discussion sections, as well as field trips, excursions and activities that will allow participants to delve into Greece's Byzantine artistic and cultural heritage.

Venue: School of Philosophy, National and Kapodistrian University of Athens, Greece.

Date: July 15, 2024 - July 26, 2024.

Course Format and Length: In-Person, 10 days, programmed courses plus examination.

Eligibility: Students of all disciplines are

encouraged to apply.

Cost: 2,000€

Accreditation: On completion of the course, each student will receive academic credits and a certificate of attendance.

The program accredits 3 ECTS (75 hours of study)



The accommodation will be made at the Annex of the Athens School of Fine Arts in Hydra.


The easiest way to get to Hydra from Athens is by catching a ferry from the port of Piraeus.


This connection is very popular, mainly during the summer, as it is one of the top day trips from Athens.

There are normally up to 2 daily crossings from Piraeus.

The ferry to Hydra takes about 1.5 hours and the average Athens to Hydra ferry ticket price for a deck seat is approximately €30.
