"Authoritarianism in the Eurasian Context: From Antiquity to the Present"

After the end of the Cold War, an optimistic view about the future of democracy and freedom prevailed in both public and academic discourses. A few vears later, however, a dominant view had arisen that democracy is under fire. Intellectuals, politicians, and citizens that a growing crisis representation threatens erode to contemporary republics and democracy is at risk all over the globe. Meanwhile, especially during the recent pandemic, there has been a growing acceptance of non-democratic forms of government, based on their efficacy in tackling emergency situations. For the first time after WW1, the competition between democracy authoritarianism is in doubt. The aim of this workshop is to bring together scholars to discuss the emerging acceptance of authoritarianism in the contemporary world and to reflect upon and derive insights from the rich historical experience and the depth of sources produced by Eurasian cultures from antiquity to the present.
